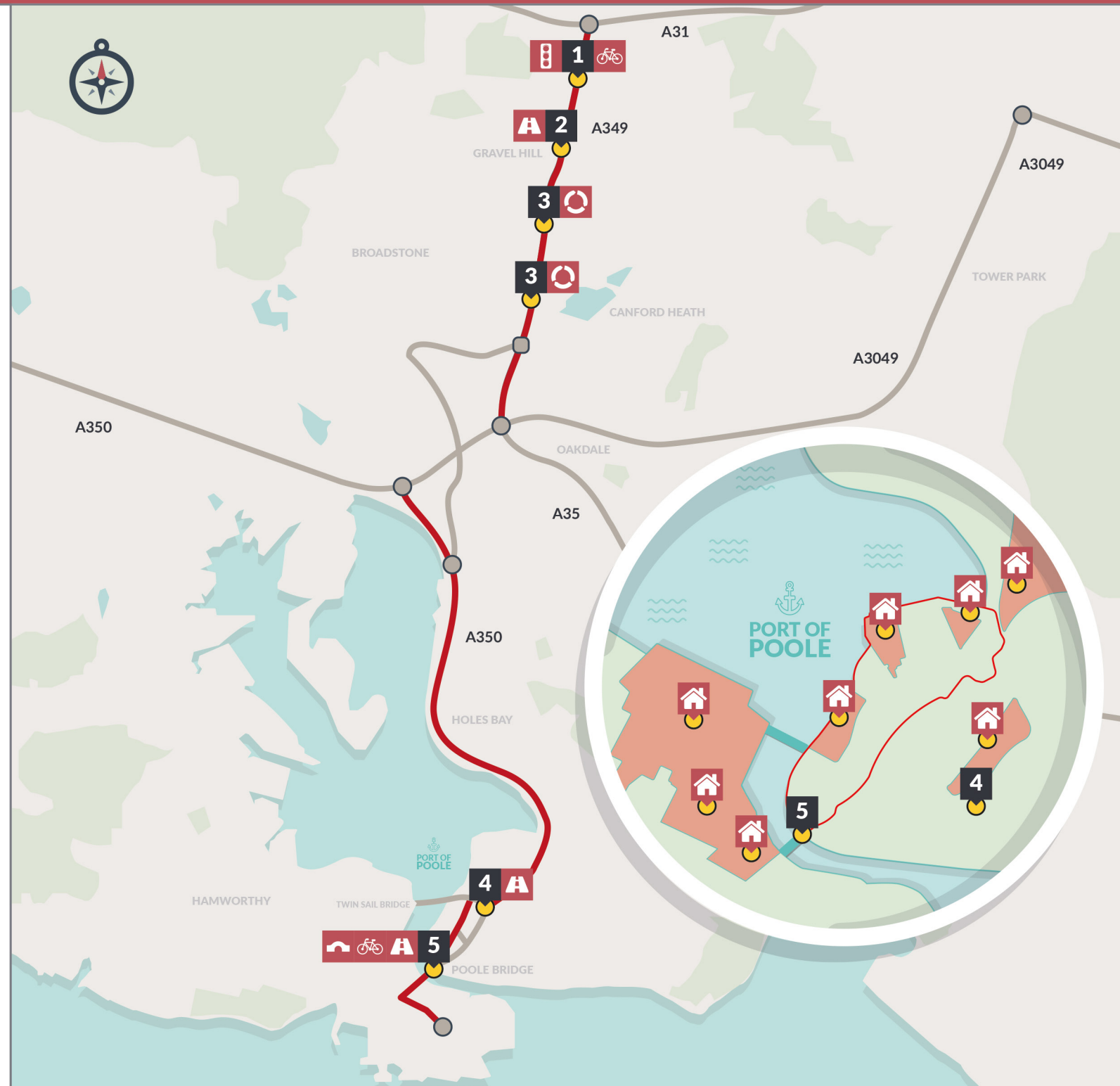

Darby's Corner & Dunyeats junction

£2 million junction improvements at Darby's Corner and Dunyeats junction to keep traffic flowing, reduce congestion and ensure more reliable journey times. Improvements for pedestrians and cyclists.

TRANSPORT



Poole Bridge new approach spans

£4.2 million to provide: new approach spans for Poole Bridge i.e. the parts of the bridge that carry traffic from land to the bridge's main section (the green copper towers); in addition, carriageway widening and new shared footway/cycleway. This will ensure residents and visitors continue to benefit from the two bridge system when travelling in and out of the Port of Poole.

Major improvements to townside access

The largest of the projects will see £13 million worth of major access improvements to the Port of Poole: townside of the Backwater Channel and development sites. Improvements to a number of key junctions including redevelopment of Hunger Hill. Improved cycling facilities, providing more pedestrian facilities and supporting development of the regeneration area.

TRANSPORT



A349 improvement works

£4.3 million investment into the A349, the prime transport corridor to the Port of Poole and the town centre, to improve the reliability of the route and journey times. Gravel Hill: stabilising and strengthening embankments; Queen Anne junction: increasing capacity for motor vehicles; overall improvement of pedestrian and cyclist facilities.
